You will be a good listener, adhere to confidentiality, relate well to children and adults and be willing to work within a team to build relationships.

Zero Tolerance Notice

Sadly, due to a number of recent incidents in our parish buildings and grounds, a sign of the times I am afraid, I need to put this statement in our newsletter concerning our Zero Tolerance Policy against abusive or threatening behaviour.

The Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth will not tolerate unacceptable behaviour and will take action to protect Clergy, employees, office holders and volunteers ('diocesan personnel') from such behaviour, including that which is abusive, threatening, or through the spreading of malicious rumours.

In response to abusive or threatening behaviour towards 'diocesan personnel,' the Bishop or the Chief Operating Officer will write to the complainant, explaining that their behaviour is unacceptable.

In response to any serious incident of aggression or violence the Diocese will immediately inform the police and communicate these actions in writing to the complainant. This may include barring an individual from any premises of the Diocese.

Do you want to Fast this Lent? This is what Pope Francis says:

From a homily he preached on February 17th, 2021.

"What are you giving up for Lent?" It's a question a lot of people will get these next few days. If you want to change your body, perhaps alcohol, sweets and cigarettes is the way to go. But if you want to change your heart, a harder fast is needed. This narrow road is gritty, but it isn't sterile. It will make room in ourselves to experience a love that can make us whole and set us free. So, if we're going to fast from anything this Lent, Pope Francis suggests that even more than sweets or alcohol, we fast from indifference towards others.

In his annual Lenten message, the Pope says: "Indifference to our neighbour and to God also represents a real temptation for us Christians. Each year during Lent we need to hear once more the voice of the prophets who cry out and trouble our conscience." These are the words of the Pope:

Fast from hurting words and say kind words,

Fast from sadness ... and be filled with gratitude, Fast from anger ... and be filled with patience, Fast from pessimism ... and be filled with hope, Fast from worries ... and have trust in God, Fast from complaints ... and contemplate simplicity, Fast from pressures ... and be prayerful, Fast from bitterness ... and fill your hearts with joy, Fast from selfishness ... and be compassionate to others,

Fast from grudges ... and be reconciled, Fast from words ... and be silent so you can listen!
