St Patrick's School

Our School liturgies continue with a Celebration of the Word for the whole school on a Tuesday afternoon led by Mrs. Hales and Fr Ross.

On Ash Wednesday Years 4 & 5 came to the parish mass in St Patrick's Church with an interactive homily given by Fr Ross and in the afternoon Mrs Hales led a Liturgy in St Patrick's School for the rest of the school where the 'mini-Vinnies' did the imposition of ashes. A Mini-Vinnie is a school age member of the St Vincent De Paul Society, of which we currently have four members in our school.

The lovely Dominican Sisters from Sway continue to come in on a Wednesday afternoon to run the JCLUB aka Jesus Club, which is a very popular after school club which is catechetical in nature but fun at the same time. Thank you to our two Benefactors who fund the entire cost of the JCLUB.

We also have our Children's Mass once a month on a Sunday morning at St Patrick's Church, the main lead is taken by Mrs Hales, Mr Travers and children from St Patrick's School.



Fr Ross continues to go up to St George College on a Friday to do the rounds and to make sure all our former St Patrick's pupils are behaving themselves, which thankfully they are on the whole, though some of course need reminding to 'be good'.

On Ash Wednesday the College had various liturgies throughout the day which involved the ashing of most the college. This was led for us by Mr Walford the Lay Chaplain and assisted by other staff members and clergy.

Last Friday when I was up at the college some very cheeky Year 11 Students reminded me that I have known them since they were in Year 3 of Springhill Primary School from when I was the one of the Chaplains there as the Assistant Priest to the City Centre Parish. This conversation brought home to me that in every year group now including Year 11 there are students that I remember and know from their time at St Patrick's Primary School also! Fr Ross is getting very old now!!! Which is basically what the cheeky Year 11's were saying to me!!!

ST PATRICK'S TREE WORKS

Some of you may have noticed that we recently needed to have a number of trees removed from the grounds in and around St Patrick's Church and Presbytery as recommended by our Tree Hazard Assessment Survey in collaboration with the Trees Department at Southampton City Council. The trees removed were either rotting in the middle or had Ash Dieback. Southampton City Council on approving the removals of the trees, some of which were on TPO's recommended that we replace the trees with other trees on the site within a year of the tree works being done. They have asked us to plant the following:

- 1) **A Yew Tree** in the rear car park area
- 2) **A Magnolia Tree** to the side of the Church running parallel with Manor Road South
- 3) **A Cherry Tree** to replace the one removed by the front car park

The cost for each of the above has been equalled out to £180 (£180 x 3 = £540) including the cost of labour to source and plant them at the size and girth recommended by the Council. If anybody would like to contribute to the cost of the trees, or in memory of someone special, please let the parish office/Fr Ross know.

Recent Audit of our Parish Finances

We were recently audited by HaysMac of London for the year ended 31st August 2024. The last time we were audited in 2019 we were graded as good with some improvements needed in stewardship and accuracy, this time we were given an excellent in stewardship & accuracy of the Parish Finances. We thank Marion Jarrett for all of her work and administration of the parish accounts – without her skills and work ethic we would not have done so well. So thank you Marion for all that you do.

Whilst this was an excellent audit report in that it focuses in on stewardship and accuracy of accounting, it does not hide the fact that St Patrick's is still in debt and Annunciation is using some of its parish reserves to function. So if you don't contribute regularly to the upkeep of our two churches, please do so and if you are a tax payer, please consider filling in a gift aid declaration so we can claim 25% back on your donation from HMRC at no extra cost to you.

St Patrick's Church Heating
